Etymology: Middle English, from Middle French, from Latin *intelligentia*, from *intelligent-*, *intelligens* intelligent

1 a : **INFORMATION** : the ability or agency to obtain and process the necessary information;

1 b : **COMPREHENSION** : the act of *understanding* and abstraction; handling concepts and models;

March 18, 6-8 pm: Modeling business data, rules and processes

1 c : **COMMUNICATION** : the capacity to communicate accurately, based on meaning and semantics;

April 1st, 6-8 pm: Business engineering for Business-IT Alliance

2 : **ADAPTABILITY** : the power to adapt to the environment, reacting to new situations and events, *also* : **CHANGE**, **INNOVATION** : changing the environment or finding an entirely new one;

3 a : **LEARNING** : the capability to learn from examples or experience; mining data, rules and processes;

April 29, 6-8 pm: Mine your own business

3 b : **REASONING** : the ability to reason; *also* : the ability to apply knowledge to one's environment for making *smart decisions*;

May 6, 6-8 pm: Smart systems for smart business

4 : **EFFECTIVENESS** the aptitude to perform information functions, according to the business goals and *compliant* with policies and rules;

May 13, 6-8 pm: Effectiveness and efficiency for business value
